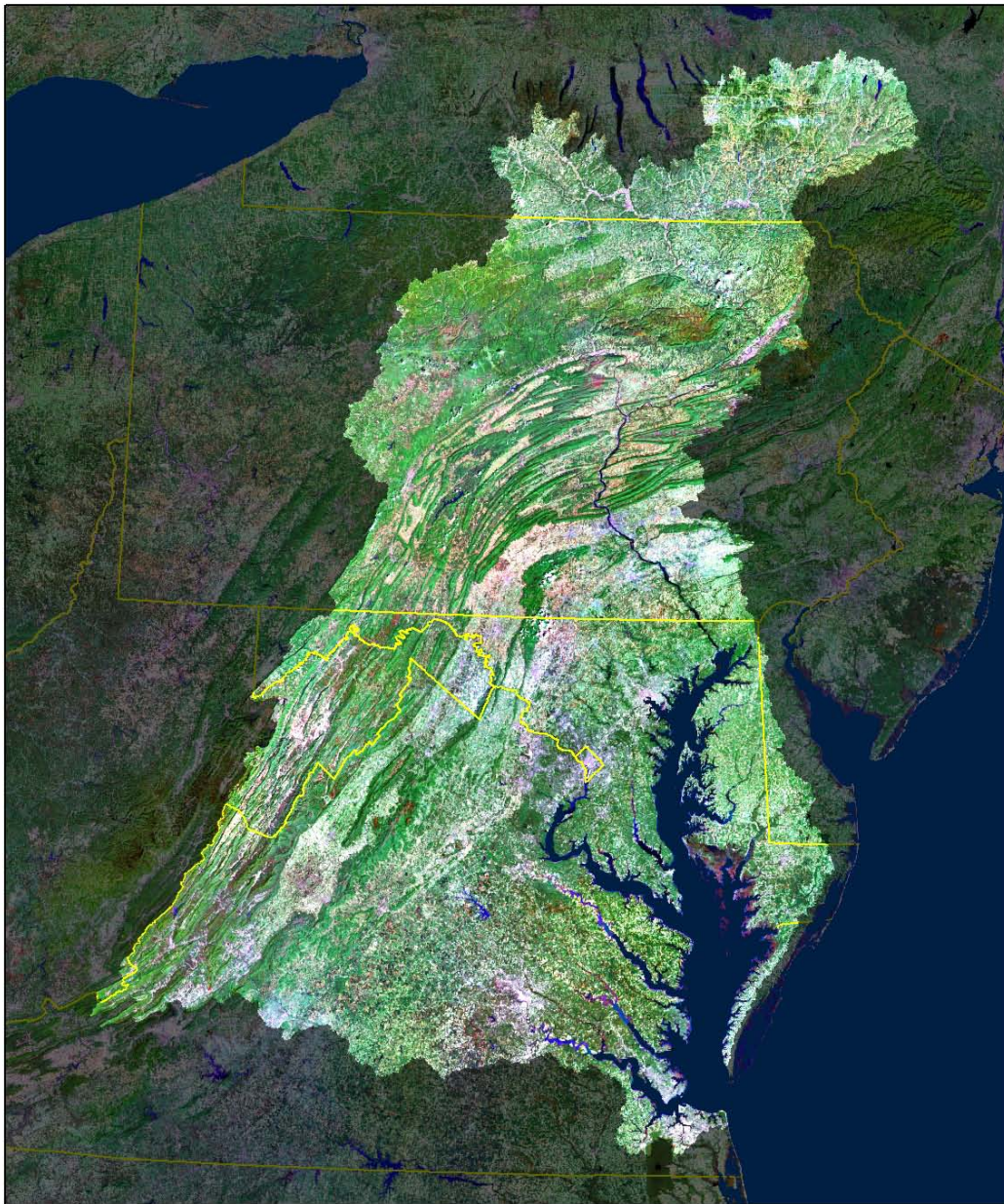

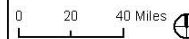

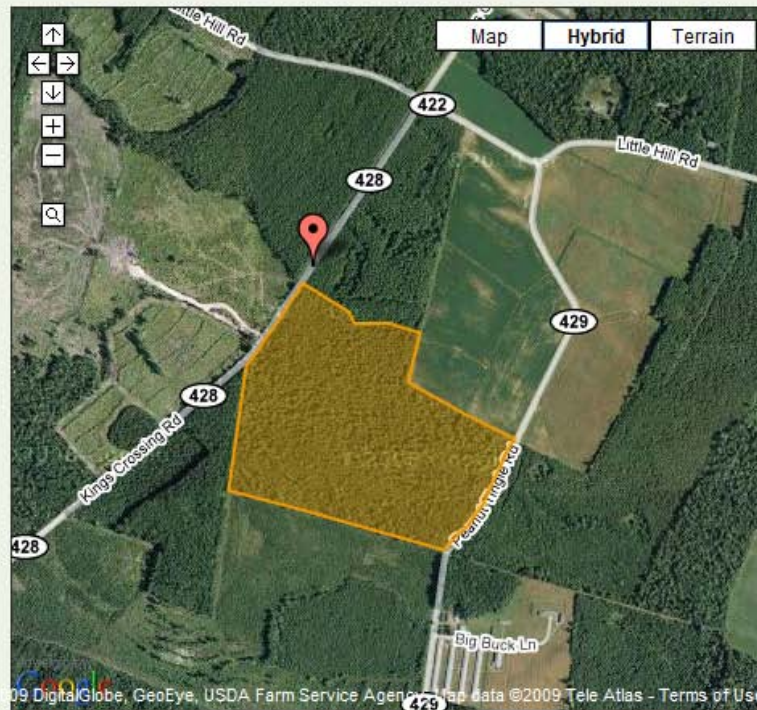
## Map My Property

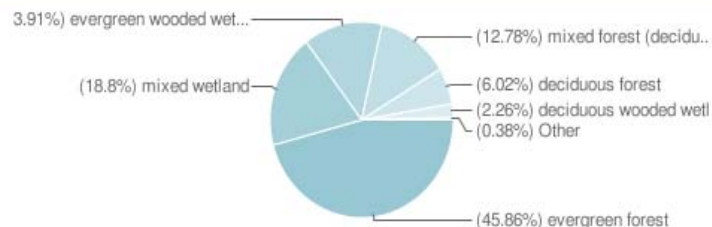
